## **Principal's Welcome Address to Staff**



We kickstarted the year with the Principal's Welcome Address to staff.

Stating Academic Rigour clearly as the school's focus, teachers were given direction and clarity on the year's objectives. The school aims "To create life entrepreneurs through holistic education and lifelong learning." The address highlighted the need for academic discipline and consequent rigour to become a way of life for our school. The Heads of School also inducted new teachers and conducted a brief refresher for existing staff, on the school's Vision and Mission, instilling pride in all the staff and a sense of belonging.

We truly believe in our motto 'In Omnia Paratus' so to assist teachers in adapting to the changing face of education, Mr. Divjot Singh from Edu Tech was invited to conduct a session on prompt engineering for AI tools. Teachers experimented with various prompts, refining their ability to generate the best possible responses. They also brainstormed various ways to incorporate AI, specifically ChatGPT, into their classrooms.

The following day, the teachers were treated to a wonderful time of sharing when the Vice Principal, Ms. Shefali Tewary took a session on EQ of an Educator. Teachers shared personal experiences of when and how their lives were shaped by the influence of a few people. Discussing the impact a teacher can have on the life of even a single student, the need for empathy and a humane approach when dealing with students was emphasized.

Ms. Priti Puri Agrawal led all teachers in a session on Becoming You Own S-Hero. Being a life coach and mindfulness trainer, she encouraged us to create clearly defined goals for ourselves and identify our core values so we could effectively work on self-improvement.

Ms. Dipti Divekar from Perceptions 360 returned to our school to lead teachers in a session on Lifestyle, Communication, and Disposition.

The Heads of School introduced teachers to the redefined role of a Teacher Advisor as per the guidelines decided upon centrally by the school. They must re-role themselves to teach the child and not the subject alone. To this effect, teachers will help students set challenging goals and mentor them as they identify and pursue their Tikkun Olam. With an emphasis on academic rigour, our team has devised ways to incorporate engaging and challenging tasks for our students through goal setting, design thinking, and experiential learning.

Our teachers also built on their program-specific knowledge through workshops on making learning more effective for which they shared their learning regarding evidencing and making learning visible in class. Teachers also shared their learning from the IB workshop on approaches to learning and how to build on them across grades. To ensure that all our learners have an engaging time at school and are constantly learning from the environment they're in, teachers in the PYP also conducted a session on the essentials of an IB classroom which highlighted the requirements for the same. To enhance the academic rigour in school and ensure our students are learning the right way, a session on concept-driven learners was organized by the team that attended the IB workshop on the same topic.

### "Passion Knows No Boundaries"





It's said that "Passion Knows No Boundaries". Our young equestrian Ronith Lahoti, has truly demonstrated that this statement is so true. Ronith is a passionate equestrian pursuing horse show jumping as a sport over the last 3 years. After winning medals in Junior National Equestrian Championship (JNEC) last year and bagging the Best Rider trophy in the Annual Equestrian Games earlier this year, Ronith has now made us proud by taking his winning stride internationally.

To hone his horse show jumping skills further, Ronith spent his summers training with the equestrians of Germany and the Netherlands for a month. During these trainings, he also participated in regional competitions to gain experience in international competitions. In the first of his international competitions in Brockhofe, Germany, Ronith placed himself in the top 10 riders securing 9th position astride his horse "Clearlight", competing with about 30 - 35 odd riders. With the hard work backing his passion over the next 2-3 weeks, Ronith won the "Gold Medal" at a competition held in Asten, Netherlands astride his horse "Porsche". There were about 30-35 riders competing in the category from countries like Netherlands, Belgium, and Germany. Ronith made us proud by placing Indian Flag on the top of the scoreboard, with his Gold Medal. His riding skills were much appreciated by his coach and other participants.

# Feisty Isabelle calls the shots

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After making his mark in Horse Show Jumping events last year, with multiple wins in competitions in India and Abroad, Ronith Lahoti has now taken up strengthening his forte in Horse Dressage sport event. While Show Jumping is about riding a horse across the course jumping fences (obstacles)

without drops and in minimum time, Dressage is the ultimate test in riding skills and horsemanship maneuvering the Horse through a predefined course and riding pattern with technically accurate riding. Ronith has already tasted his initial success by winning a silver medal astride Horse Carla Levista in the recently concluded Pre Novice Dressage Test at the Embassy Premier League 2023 in Bangalore on 29th July; 2023 We wish Ronith to make his mark in Dressage too this year in competitions across the country and abroad.
