Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI) is a global non-profit organization and a governing body with a vision to grow the unique and mutually beneficial bond between horses and humans in sport globally ([www.fei.org](http://www.fei.org)). Their mission is to drive and develop equestrian sport globally in a modern, sustainable, and structured manner with guaranteed integrity, athlete welfare, equal opportunity, and a fair and ethical partnership with the horse. In this endeavour, they host Show Jumping World Challenge competitions across various countries every year. This event happens every year in India too. This year's event was hosted at the Embassy International Riding School, Bangalore in November ([www.embassyridingschool.in](http://www.embassyridingschool.in)). On day 1 of the event on 8th Nov., Ronith demonstrated his skills at the sport, by successfully completing two clear rounds astride horse Bangie De Prissy. ## Career Counselling and College Placement

### Early Applications:

A record 44 students from Indus Pune sent their applications to universities in the US and UK for the Early Decision/ Early Action round. The list mostly includes various selective universities from the US. Students understand that most of the undergraduate offers are rolled out in the early round. The early application has various advantages:

- An early application means that you intend to attend a particular school if admitted but are not bound to.
- Higher acceptance rate - Colleges like students who choose early action and early decision because it allows them to fill their upcoming classes earlier and easier.
- Reduced stress - While getting the application done early can be stressful, getting a decision far ahead of time provides peace of mind because you know you've already been accepted into one school for sure,
- More time to decide - Getting an Early Action admittance means you can take more time to decide if you want to attend, versus worrying if you could get in at all.
- Take advantage of the priority status in the housing and roommate selection process.
- You can hold an acceptance from an Early Action school and apply to additional schools without a consequence.
- You have the opportunity to apply and compare financial aid packages from many schools.

Drawbacks:

- Reduced Financial Aid Opportunity – Students accepted through Early Action or Early Decision often have lower-value financial aid packages.

Rise is a program that finds promising young people and provides opportunities for life as they work to serve others. The program starts at ages 15–17 and encourages a lifetime of service and learning by providing support that includes need-based scholarships, mentorship, networking, access to career development opportunities, and the potential for additional funding as Rise Global Winners work toward solving humanity's most pressing problems. An initiative of Schmidt Futures and the Rhodes Trust, Rise is the anchor program of a \$1 billion commitment from Eric and Wendy Schmidt to find and support global talent. Students from Grades 9-11 are highly encouraged to apply for this program.

The University of British Columbia and the University of Waterloo gave an hour-long presentation to students enlightening them about the various programs, application requirements, scholarships and criteria, Co-Op Programs, stay-back opportunities, and many more. Many students learn the MATH requirements and various exams conducted by these universities. Most importantly the officials emphasized that there is no impact on education and student visas in the current situation standoff situation amongst India and Canada.

Canada has not suspended visa services to Indian students. The visas are being approved as earlier, even for January and May intake. Fall 2024 intake timelines are further away. Besides, the students already in Canada applying for study permit extensions, PGWP, and PR are getting approvals as earlier. The Consulate General of India in Toronto has expanded its consular services for Indian citizens in Canada. These extended services encompass passport issuance, attestation, police clearance certificate issuance, and passport renewal. Most Canadian universities have issued statements for continued support and solidarity with Indian students amidst the diplomatic row. Several students residing in Canada have confirmed that the situation on the ground is calm and peaceful. It is business as usual for the residents.



We look forward to having more such country-specific sessions, where admission reps can educate our students well and help them make an informed decision about their university choices.

ACT (American College Testing) exam is a standardized test, which is required as part of undergraduate admissions to US universities. ACT is mostly taken by high school students. 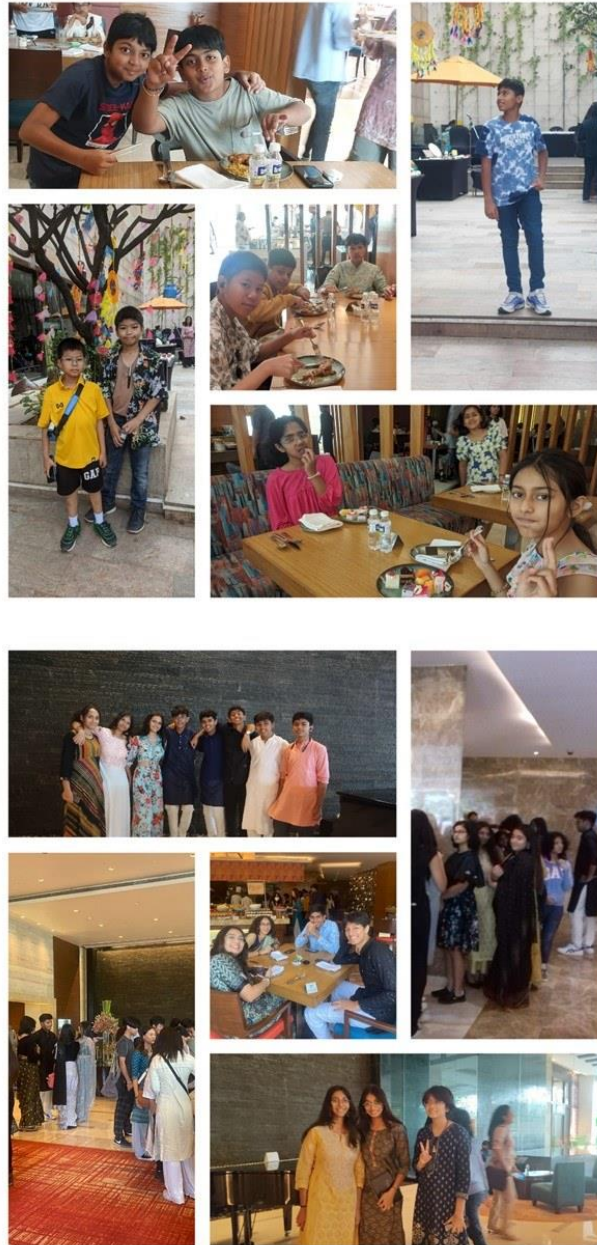
### 4th & 5th November: Lunch Outing at Hyatt

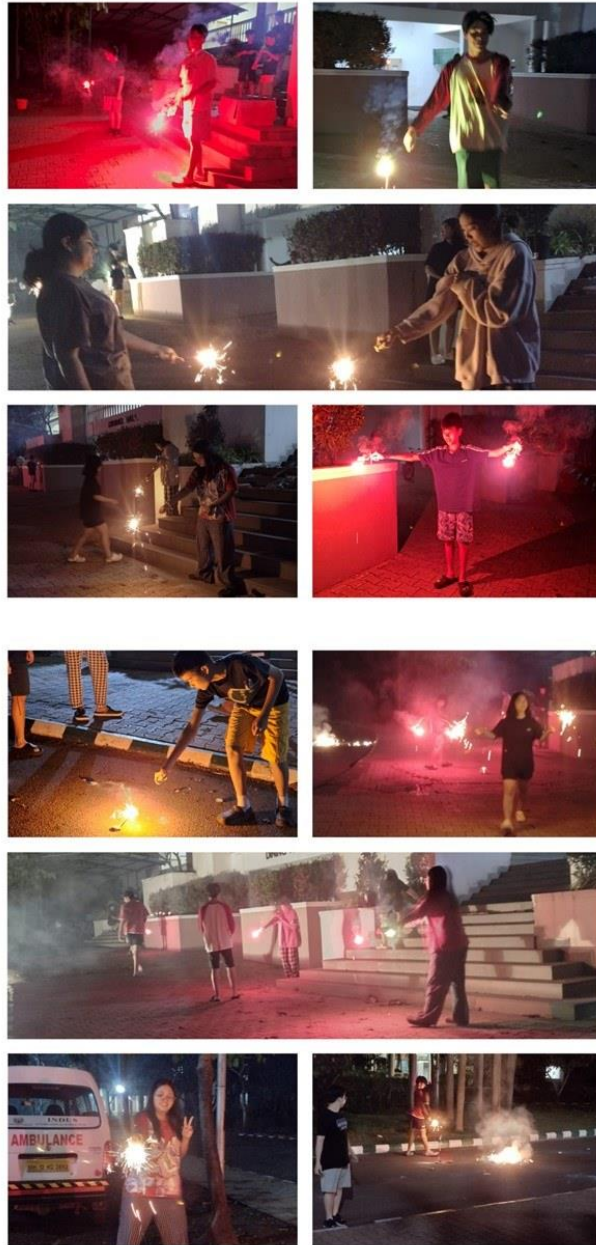
### 11th November: Mall Outing
