## **Primary Years Programme (PYP)**



1 - Book Tasting

#### **Book Tasting**

The first round was used as a diagnostic exam to analyse the needs of the grades to ensure and build on the requirements of academic rigor.

## Coffee Morning - August 21st 2023







#### Zaina Kudichiwala Achievement



Zaina Kudchiwala, a Grade 12 student, exhibits a remarkable passion for computers and data science. Over the course of the year, she has been devotedly exploring the field. During the summer, she actively sought to upskill herself in data science by attending Scaler's masterclasses. Through these classes, she gained valuable knowledge in Python programming, Tableau visualization, machine learning fundamentals, and principal component analysis. The experience broadened her understanding of key concepts and equipped her with practical skills essential for a career in data science. For her first summer project, she worked on Sentiment Analysis utilizing Deep Learning and BERT with Coursera. She used BERT (Bidirectional Encoder Representations from Transformers) to classify tweets into positive and negative sentiment classes. She also used Transfer Learning to fine-tune the pre-trained BERT models for the project. For her second summer project, she worked on Distributed Multi-worker TensorFlow Training on Kubernetes with Google. She used Kubeflow, a Google-developed open-source platform for ML and AI, to deploy a distributed multi-worker TensorFlow training job on Kubernetes. Additionally, she worked on optimizing the training job using GPU resources. Her project involved understanding the architecture of Kubeflow and Kubernetes, as well as learning the concepts of distributed machine learning.



We are really proud to share Roniths victory for the Chennai Regional leagues.



Moreover, Ronith demonstrated his competence by winning 2 bronze medals at the event in 2 rounds of Horse Show Jumping astride horses Bangie De Prissy and Lambiek.

To qualify for participation in JNEC, a rider has to clear atleast 2 rounds of Horse Show Jumping at 2 different state level championships / RELs with a specified score. Ronith had already cleared his first round at the Embassy Premier League 2023 in Bangalore on 29th July 2023.
