


Inter Class Cultural Festival & Dussehra Assembly



"Braving the Waves: MYP Year 4 Students' Epic Arabian Sea Adventure"



MYP Year 4 CAD/3D Challenge: Inspiring Sustainable Urban Visions









28st October: Treasure Hunt














Mahira Ahuja-Grade XI - IBDP 1
