All students have been engaging in various STEM tasks related to the units being pursued in class on a weekly basis. From using their imagination to create new products to using Lego and blocks to construct and replicate designs, our youngest eagles are keen to put their STEAM skills to the test.

PYP 3

In the unit, 'How we organize our selves', the learners displayed their understanding of Sustainable cities by becoming city planners and making a 2D and 3D model of their city. Their project integrated science through concepts like rainwater harvesting, solar panels, STP, windmills, and green spaces. The use of recyclable materials like cardboard, plastic bottles, and paper to build the 3D model showed their creative expression through art. Learners used basic concepts of area and measurement in math to ensure everything fits well in their city. This interdisciplinary approach helped them interconnect with real-world issues.

PYP 4

After learning about the stages an archaeologist uses to excavate an artifact, students applied their understanding to a real-life scenario. They became archaeologists, ready to excavate artifacts hidden in a designated area of the school. After surveying the land, they created grids to pinpoint the exact dig sites. In groups, they excavated the artifacts and then analyzed, sorted, and labeled the discovered objects, preparing them for preservation. Following the dig, students maintained detailed records. Through this STEM activity, learners honed their research skills and experienced the processes involved in collecting, analyzing, and validating evidence.

PYP 5

In the unit, 'How We Organize Ourselves,' students explored the concept of needs versus wants through a hands-on STEAM activity. As part of the 'Convenience Store' task, learners selected five items they would purchase from a shop and recorded their choices using tally marks to track the popularity of each item. This data was then transformed into bar graphs, allowing students to visualize their collective buying decisions. Through this engaging process, they reflected on their choices and gained a deeper understanding of the difference between needs and wants, while also incorporating elements of math and critical thinking.

Celebrating the spirit of Olympics



International Award for Young People (IAYP) programme













Indus International School hosted an orientation session of the International Award for Young People (IAYP) on 12th September 2024 for MYP 3, 4, and DP 1.

The session was led by Ms. Kavita Patil, West Zone Programme Manager of IAYP India, and Ms. Anugya Aggrawal, IAYP Award Leader and Coordinator, IISP.

This Award Programme originated in the United Kingdom in 1956 as the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme (DEAS). The aim was to help young people bridge the gap between adolescence and adulthood smoothly. Introduced in India in 1962, today it is called the International Award for Young People (IAYP). It aims to encourage young people to achieve their full growth potential within the framework of Indian Society, and to improve their moral, social, and intellectual well-being. The Programme also inculcates and encourages 'Leadership' qualities. The objective was also to motivate young people, aged 14 to 25 years, and involve them in a balanced programme of voluntary self-development activities, to take them through potentially difficult periods between adolescence and adulthood.

During this session, students gained an insight on the following-

1. **Overview of the IAYP Framework:** Understanding the structure and objectives of the program, including the three levels – Bronze, Silver, and Gold.

- 2. Requirements for Each Level:
- Bronze Award: Activities and achievements needed to attain the bronze level.
- Silver Award: Additional requirements beyond Bronze.
- Gold Award: Comprehensive overview, including the Expedition and Residential Project.

3. Benefits of Completing the IAYP: Exploring the personal and professional advantages of enrolling in the program.

The session concluded with a Q&A segment, where all questions related to registration and future benefits were addressed and we are happy to see the excitement and encouragement in the students to pursue this programme.

Innovative Plastic Waste Management




Ronith Lahoti, Roniet Shende, Riyan Lodha, and Aarsh Muttha from Indus International School and Mahindra International School have again embarked on their second do and demonstrate project on using Plastic Waste Tar for Road Maintenance and Restoration. This time they are touching the lives of senior citizens from Raja Shree Shivray Prathishthan's "Matoshree Vrudh Ashram", an old age home located in Karve Nagar, Pune.

Ronit, Roniet, Riyan, and Aarsh, this time came across the road stretch at the entrance of Matoshree which needed restoration. They mobilized about Rs. 1.60 Lakhs from their business supporters Oxford Group, Lunkad Reality, and Nareetaa Boutique, and collaborated with the management team at Matoshree to restore this stretch. Mr. Prithviraj Sutar (City Councillor) and his team applauded the vision and efforts of the young students.

The students have also completed a do-and-demonstrate project on using Plastic Waste Tar for 3 KM stretch road maintenance at Angrewadi Village in March 2024. Before that, the Plastic Warriors team have been promoting innovative plastic waste management for almost two years. The students at his school are encouraged to bring household plastic waste to school once in a few months. The collected plastic waste is then handed over to Keshav Sita Foundation & Rudra Environmental Solutions for conversion to usable polyfuels. Around 200 Kg. of plastic waste has been collected and put to use since then and the count is still going on. 




We have equipped the lab with state-of-the-art 3D printers(photopolymer resin and filament), 3D- Ferret scanners, design software, robotics kits, IoT systems, and machine learning controllers, ensuring that our learners have access to the latest technology to explore and apply their knowledge.

From day one, our most enthusiastic students have been diving into real-world projects, applying classroom concepts to exciting new challenges. They have already embarked on fascinating initiatives, such as creating a prototype of a smart bin to promote cleanliness in Indian wedding halls using machine

learning, designing a paper piano with Makey Makey to explore conductivity and music, and developing a hydrogen level indicator for manufacturing safety on the shop floor.

Students are also engaging in STEAM activities integrated into their regular curriculum, showcasing their deeper understanding of concepts by developing practical proof of concepts.

We are proud of the enthusiastic response from our students and excited to witness their journey as they continue to "get their hands dirty" with these impactful projects. We look forward to seeing more inspiring work from our STEAM lab!



ADMISSIONS TESTS – USA – SAT & ACT

SAT (SCHOLASTIC ASSESSMENT TEST)

The SAT is an entrance exam used by most colleges and universities to make admissions decisions. The SAT is a multiple-choice, computer-based test created and administered by the College Board in the USA. The purpose of the SAT is to measure a high school student's readiness for college and provide colleges with one common data point that can be used to compare all applicants.

Indus International School Pune is an official SAT Test Center (code: 63752) and the college counselling team provides numerous resources to its high school students for the preparation of this important test. The team conducted the SAT exam on 24th August for 63 students.




Next Genius College Fair: A Gateway to Prestigious Universities

Morning Fitness


