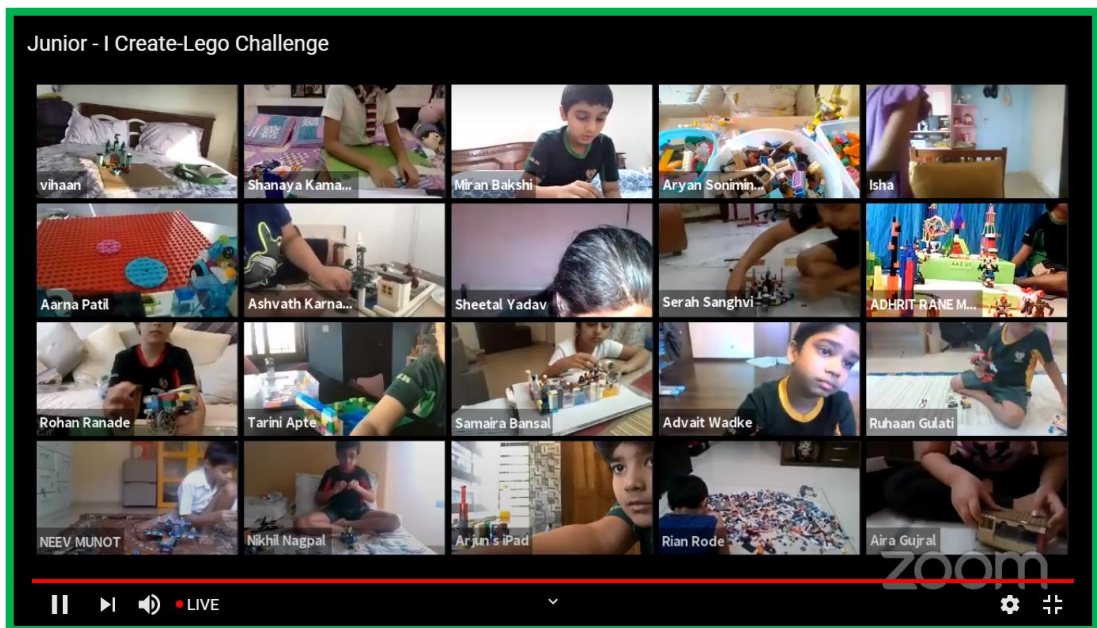
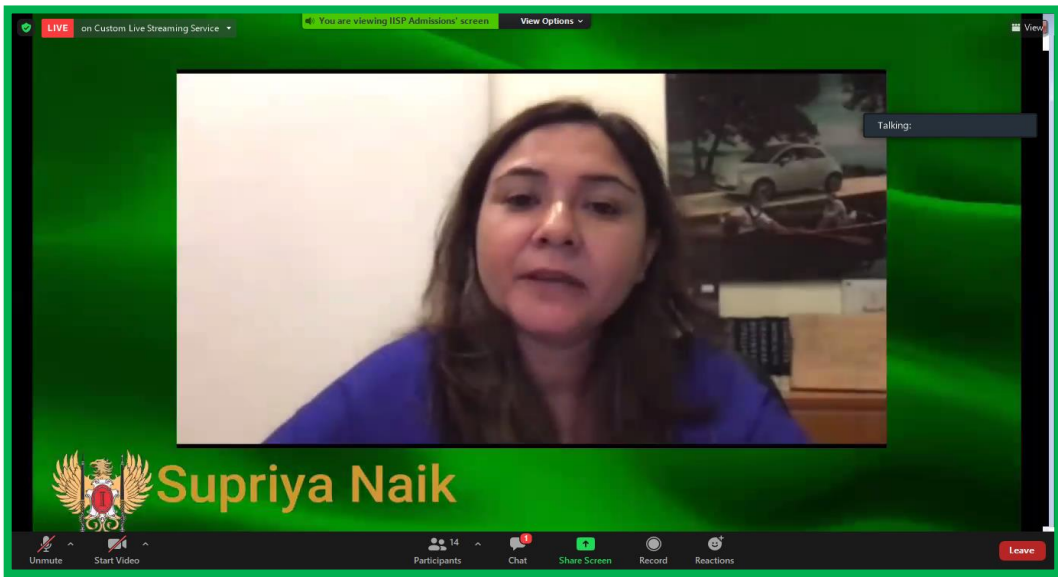
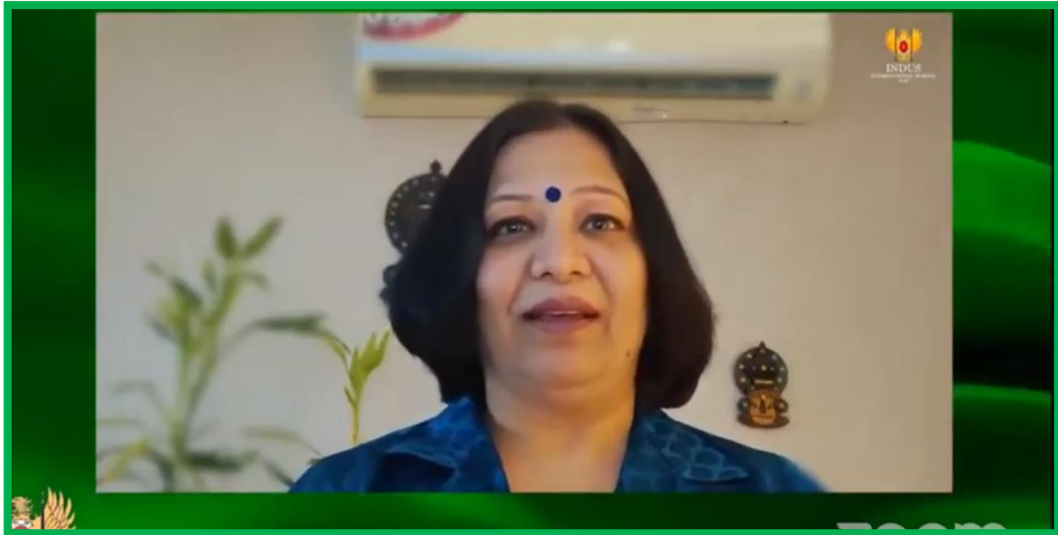
I LEAD CUP Finale:

THE INDUS STARTUP SCHOOL UPDATE:

The Start-up school continues to explore and challenge the creative energies of students. Its focus on growth mind-set in thinking about real world problems brings out the absolutely essential element of relevance and dynamism in education.

In the month of November, Students focused on the DTP (Design Thinking Project) challenge on climate change. Students finished reading stage 1 of Chutzpah and had a discussion on the same reflecting deeply on how children in Israel grow up with different childhood experiences and if that might be the reason for this small nation to be one of the leading hubs for innovation in the world.

The case studies that were shared this month, made the students reflect upon the leadership styles and its impact on the stakeholders and society. The case study on Twitter CEO Jack Dorsey and pondered if his laissez faire style of leadership is suitable for a company. Comparing this style with managers who micromanage, they debated on the pros and cons of the same and reflected on how things may be different if they were more hands on.

Leadership Talks

The weekly leadership talks by our CEO & MD, Lt Gen Arjun Ray focused on imagination, curiosity and creativity driving home the point that positive thinking and imagination are essential for creativity. The talk also focused on how to transform imagination to a viable idea, helping learners to understand that creativity is not a gift and that it can be cultivated with intentional practise. The importance of identifying and leveraging your signature strengths and weaknesses can prove to be instrumental in developing creativity. This talk certainly helped the learners with strategies to cultivate creativity and imagination!

Dr Uday Saxena a successful entrepreneur in the field of pharmaceuticals and a parent of IISH conducted an informative session on “How to start a start-up from baby steps to adult strides”. In this session, Mr Saxena focussed on the key aspects one needs to focus on when launching a start-up. From how to test if an idea is incremental or moon shot, whether it is commercially viable to the importance of having a business plan, a strong management team, funding options, importance of patents and exit strategies, Mr Saxena touched upon critical aspects to look into in a short but very effective session.

Ms Preeti Prabhu, the Chief Philosophy Officer at Indus led a session on ethical creativity. During our entrepreneurial journey and even in day to day life, we often come upon decisions that lead to ethical dilemmas. A social experiment by Harvard Business Review was discussed which threw light upon the fact that some people may take advantage of situations and behave unethically. Ms Prabhu explained the ethical decision model and students were given two hypothetical problem statements and were then challenged to make ethical decisions on the same following the model. What ensued was a riveting

discussion on why a course of action may be more suitable than others. While the entrepreneurs journey is most likely for making profits it is also important to remember our values and ethics was the conclusion made. This indeed was a great learning experience for all.

As the students understand the balance between Moral and Ethical man, the start-up school continues to inspire them through hands-on projects that help students apply their learning and work towards a milestone which will change the world forever.

Guest Speaker Session: Grade 4 is inquiring into “rituals, traditions and artefacts provide a window into the beliefs and values of cultures” under the transdisciplinary theme - How we express ourselves. 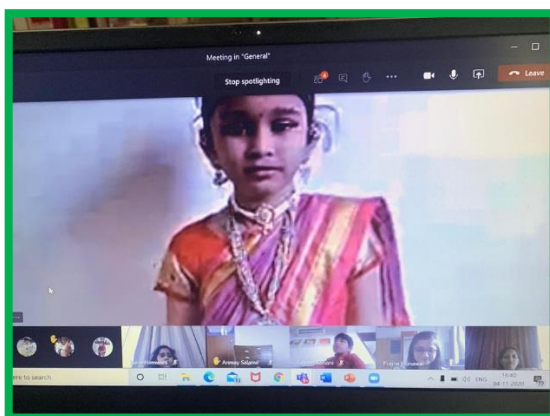

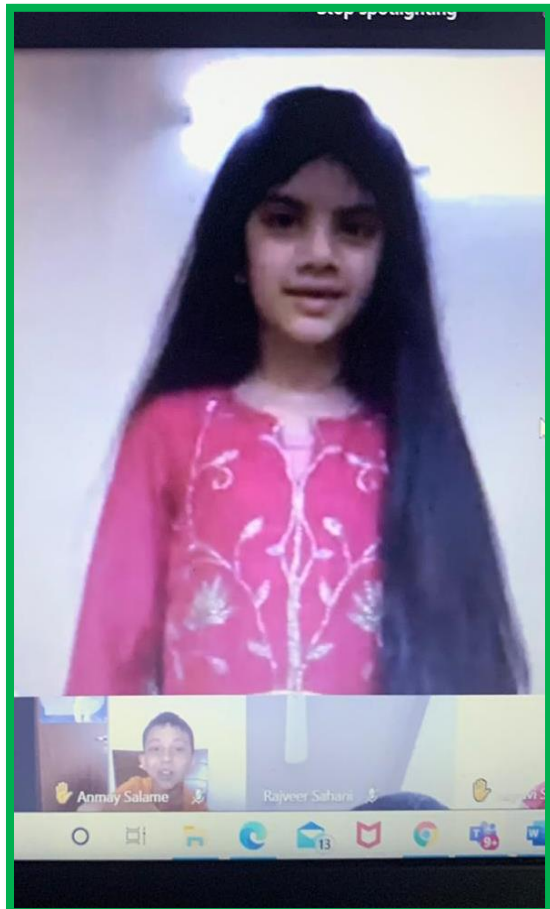
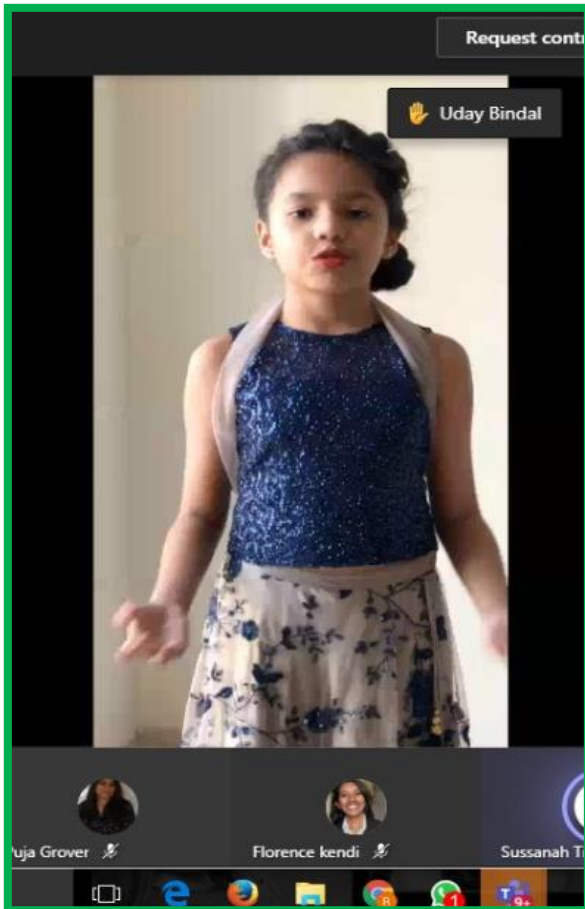
Celebrations:

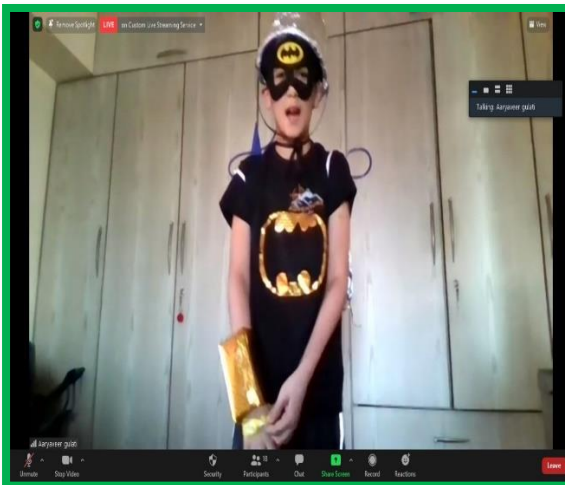
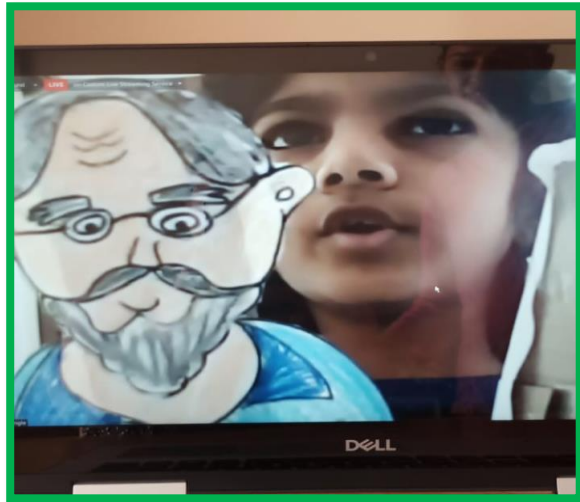
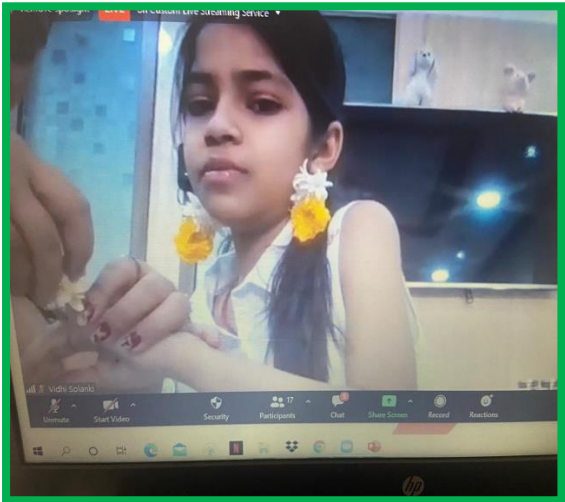


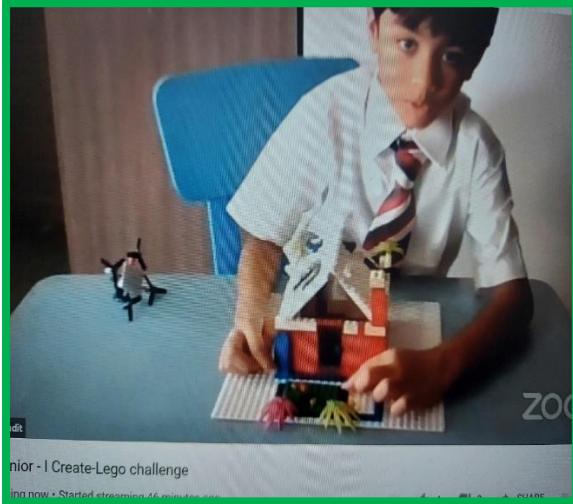
Leadership Curriculum:

Our learners are well on their way to change the course of their future by building on their budding entrepreneurial competencies.

I LEAD DAY: In a gala three- and half-day event, learners across the school participated in a variety of challenges, demonstrating their varied talent and skills. PYP, alone hosted 51 events, and our young learners never ceased to amaze us with their creativity and critical thinking skills. Our judges, all of whom were specially invited for the events, were all praises for our little eagles and the effort they put in. It is also with pride that we acknowledge our wonderful teachers for planning and managing such a large event online with perfect coordination!







Student council: In the first ever virtual investiture ceremony graced by our CEO Lt. General Arjun Ray the school student council took a solemn oath to complete their duties to the best of their abilities without favour or prejudice. The ceremony was streamed on you tube where our proud parents witnessed the proceedings. We wish our council the best in all their endeavours.

Professional Development: Ms Helen Furtado, the EYP coordinator led a session on formative assessments and tracking the same through an informative and interactive discussion. The formative assessment can be an assessment for learning or of learning. This is a tool used by educators to help them plan future lessons as it helps them understand if the concept and relevance of a unit or topic is understood by the students. It also helps them gauge the students' skill development.

Parent Orientations:

The PYP counselor Ms Prajakta Apte, led a truly relevant session on the new normal after COVID 19. Focusing on the parents' emotional needs and how to identify them, she also equipped them with strategies to deal with the change. She offered several strategies they can use to help their children cope with the demands of the emerging situation. Educationing is a new term that allows us to think of education beyond traditional confines and focuses on developing life skills. Ms Apte elucidated these points well and the workshop was a welcome learning experience for all concerned.

Middle Years Programme (MYP):

Academics:

At Indus, we believe in Holistic Education. This means that academics is given as much importance as co-curricular learning. The month of November saw learners enhance their conceptual understanding across subjects. Learners also participated in intense revision exercises which were done in class as well as in the Support Sessions conducted for the same. Portfolio subjects had their extended summative submissions across different criteria with portfolio's being due on the 20th of this month. This gave learners enough time to focus on intense revision with submissions taken care of.

The Half Yearly Exams will commence from 4th December 2020.

I-Lead Cup:

The first ever Innovation and Leadership Cup Championships were held at IISP. What made this event memorable and a grand success was the fact that such an event was never heard of or seen before, not just at Indus, but in any educational institution. 117 events were conducted across 4 days. Learners participated and competed for their houses in three categories: 'I-Think', 'I-Create' and 'I Express'. After intense participation which also saw parents come together to win points, the final standing was: Phoenix, Hercules, Pegasus and Orion. The closing ceremony had teachers wish all our learners a 'Happy Children's Day', in their own unique way. The I-Lead Cup gave learners an opportunity to enhance each aspect of their communication, thinking and creative skills. We can hardly wait for the I-Lead Cup to begin next year for it truly was a great show of unity, house-spirit and the school core values.





Coffee Evenings:

It is with immense delight that we present to you our latest initiative, that of the Coffee Evenings. We realise that in the hustle-bustle of life in the COVID World, we hardly get enough time to just be and chat with our students. To this effect, we have decided to hold Coffee Evenings once a month.

This is where all the learners of a Grade are invited to spend an evening with their respective Programme Coordinators and the HOS. We had Coffee Evenings from Grades 6 to 10 where learners spoken about anything and everything. We played games like Hangman and discussed series like, 'The Crown'. Learners spoke of their experiences in the lockdown while we told them how much we missed them. The session had laughs and emotional moments and one important realisation, that we miss our families... the ones we saw 8 months ago.

Leadership Curriculum:

Leadership Curriculum is a time to reflect on the skills and competencies that we are pursuing through our Academics and Innovation Curriculum and apply the same in our daily lives. Our learners have been collaborating in groups, brainstorming on various ideas coming up with unique solutions and designs to the challenges while working through design thinking process. They demonstrated key leadership skills like, creative and critical thinking, team work and persuasive communication.

Student Council / Investiture Ceremony:

Like all things virtual, we decided to celebrate student leadership virtually too. Nothing is harder than being a leader in tough times and we are ever so proud of the outgoing council for being so resilient.

We are also proud of the new student council who have always displayed grit, determination, and courage, not just during Offline School but virtually as well.

The council members were chosen after intense rounds of interviews, followed by voting and the final result declaration.

Learners spent time practicing for the first ever Investiture Ceremony which was held virtually and we felt a deep sense of bitter sweetness as we bid adieu to the outgoing members and welcomed our new leaders.

Diploma Programme (DP):

November saw Student Council members being formally sworn in at the Investiture ceremony. The highlight of the ceremony was the chief guest, the CEO and MD Indus Trust, Lt. Gen Arjun Ray providing a vision for the newly elected Council members and sharing the plans for the new Innovation Council that will be appointed from the following year.

The DP2 students' TOK essays were moderated by select teachers; while students worked on their IA (Internal Assessment) submissions. The exercise of completing all IAs by December is extremely crucial as this year too all IAs will be uploaded for the May 2021 exams. Since the weightage of these IAs in some subjects have increased, the teachers will have more time to go over them and give some time to students to polish them further.

The CAS (Creativity, Activity and Service) program is catching momentum despite being on a virtual platform. The Hercules House has tied up with the NGO Raah Foundation to see how members can raise funds for its program targeting underprivileged children.

The important skill required to raise funds - crowd funding was introduced and reiterated in a formal session on 30th November 2020 held for Grade 11 students. This will help strengthen the CAS activities, the DP1 students undertake in the service area.

Due to the overwhelming response for the Grand parents' day celebration organized by Orion House, another virtual event was organized this month- which saw good participation from students in Grade 11 – where grandparents played a variety of games.

Leadership and Innovation Curriculum:

This month saw Leadership and Innovation Curriculum merging with two parallel syllabi running for those who are in Startup School and those who are not a part of it.

The focus is on Deep reading and Experimentation - with DTP (Design Thinking Project) and collaborative tasks to solve real world problems such as Climate change.

Professional Development:

Professional development saw teachers largely focusing on reviewing predicted grades for the future and going over the IA criteria department wise, in order to start the Moderation process.

In a Separate session with Staff and Heads of Department, a formal orientation on the different aspects of DTP and Experimentation was provided. Among other things, the focus was also on preparing a new template for Intensive revision in order to make it more effective.

Guidance and Placements:

The guidance and placements department has conducted Cambridge Pre-Interview assessments and Oxford admission test for the students. Counselors and students have been busy with meeting early action/early decision application deadlines of 1st November to 15th November.
