
| Teacher Advisor | Meetings

DP1 Curriculum Road Map Day





CAS Orientation By Ms Ashwini Sirpotdar



The competition was intense, with each round presenting new challenges and pushing them to think critically and on their feet. Despite the pressure, they stood strong and supported one another every step of the way.


